- An applicant must be a United States (US) citizen. Proof of US citizenship includes the following documents: a US birth certificate, a current US passport, or government-issued naturalization papers.
- An applicant must attend or plan to attend an accredited college or university in the United States.

Included in the scholarship categories are Nursing Scholarships:

Caroline E. Holt Nursing Scholarship

A one-time \$2,500 award is given to three students who are in financial need and who have been accepted or is currently enrolled in an accredited school of nursing. A letter of acceptance into a nursing program or a transcript stating the applicant is in a nursing program must be included with the application. Questions? Mildred Nutting Nursing Scholarship

A one-time \$2,000 scholarship for two students who are in financial need and who have been accepted or are currently enrolled in an accredited school of nursing.
